

Education Pluralism, Learning Poverty, and the Right to Education


Welcoming children of all faiths and contributing to education pluralism and the right to education, the Catholic Church manages one of the largest networks of schools and universities in the world, especially in low income countries at the primary level.





In 2018, Catholic schools and universities served 68 million students, with the largest group in primary schools.

Primary Enrollment Shares (%, 2018)




7 in 10 children in primary Catholic schools globally live in low and lower-middle income countries.

Over 40+ years, growth in enrollment has been highest at the higher education level and for pre-primary education.

In the United States, the COVID-19 crisis has led to the largest drop in Catholic schools enrollment in almost 50 years.




In many low income countries such as the DRC, access to distance learning is limited by low digital connectivity rates.


More than \$100 Billion (PPP)
